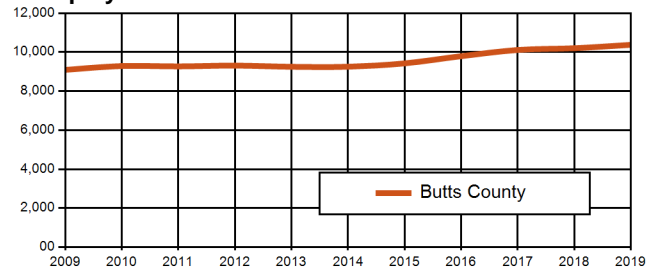

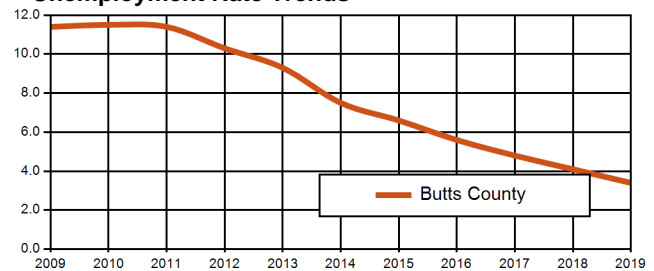

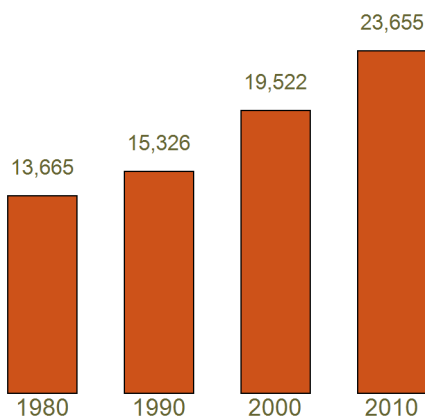
Employment Trends

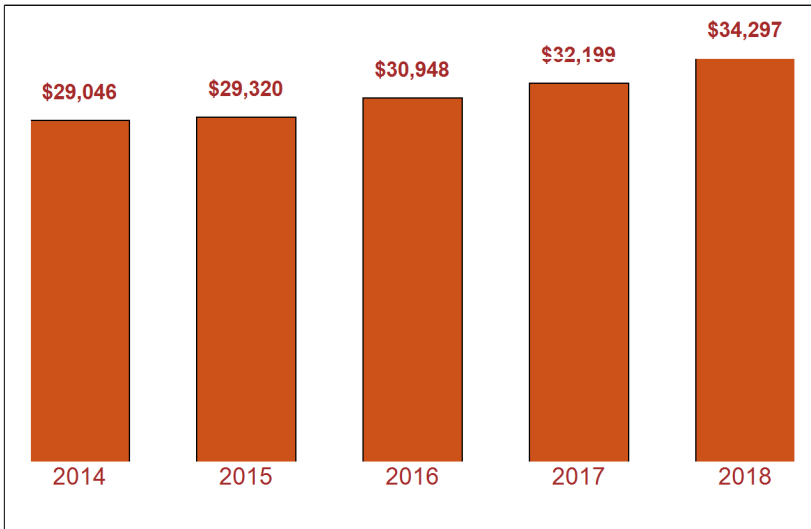

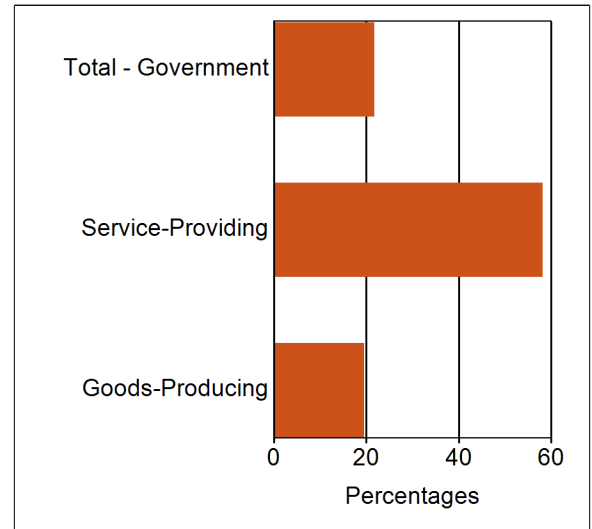
