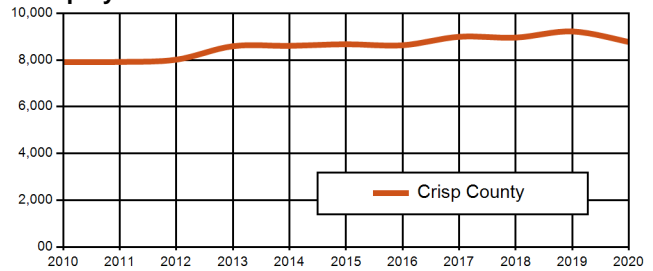

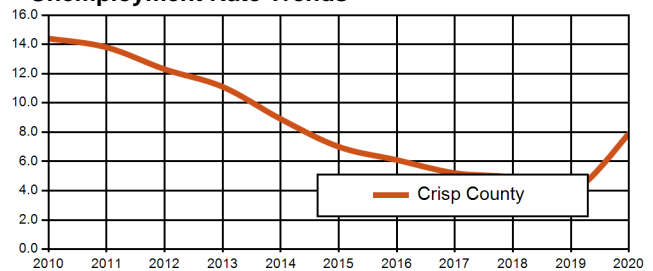

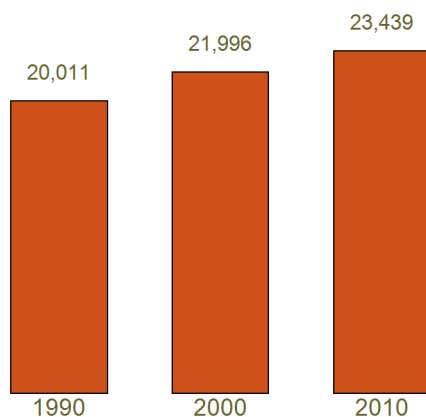

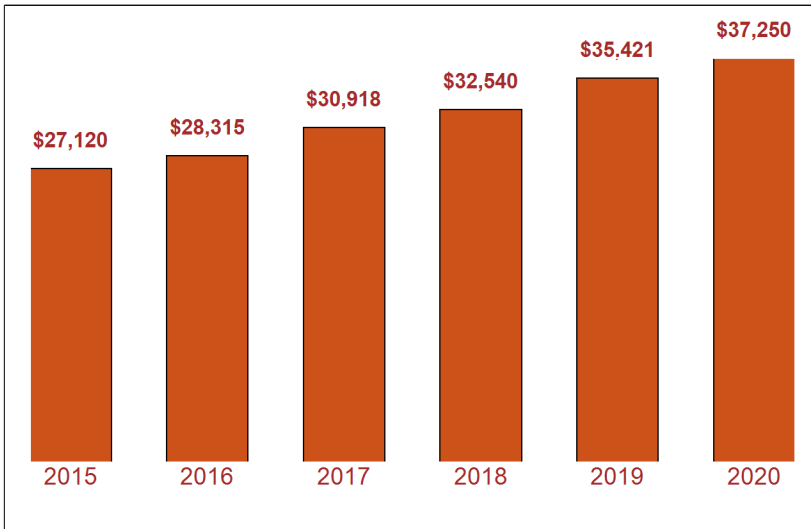

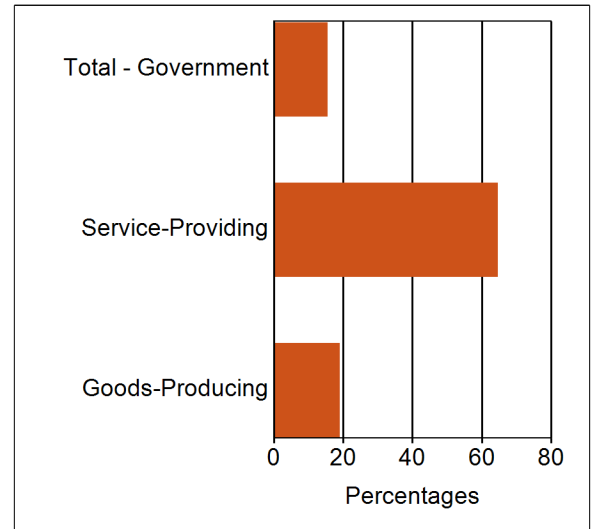
Crisp Per Capita Income
