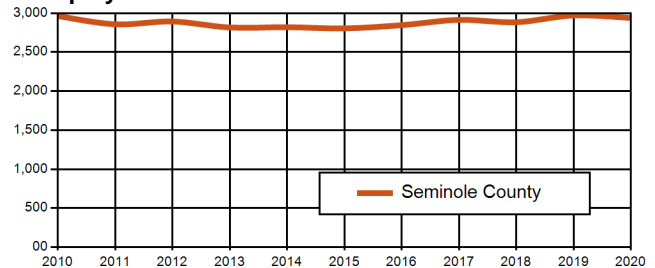

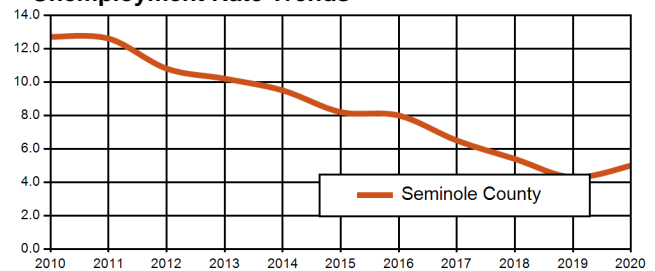

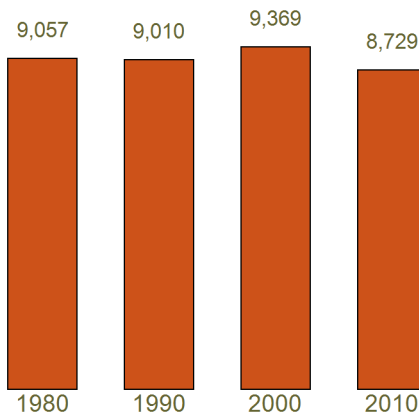

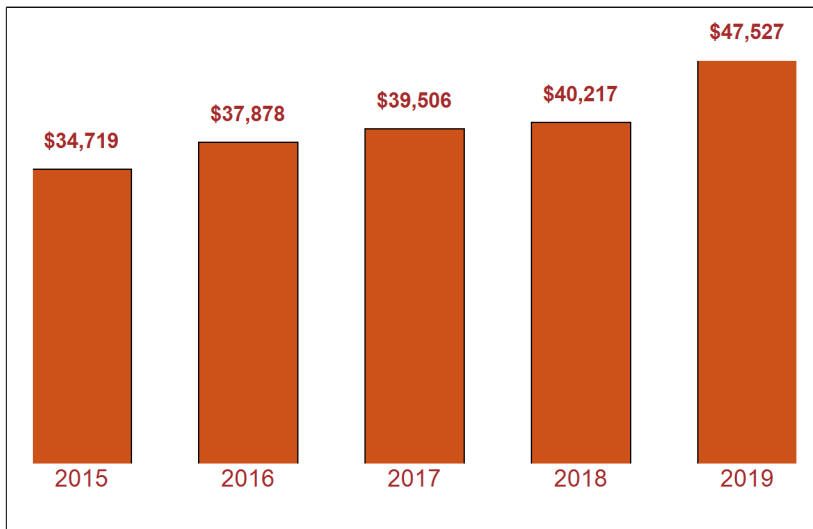

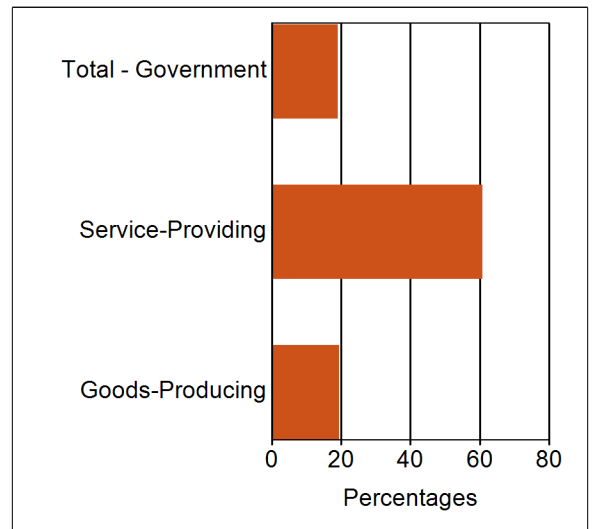
Seminole Per Capita Income
