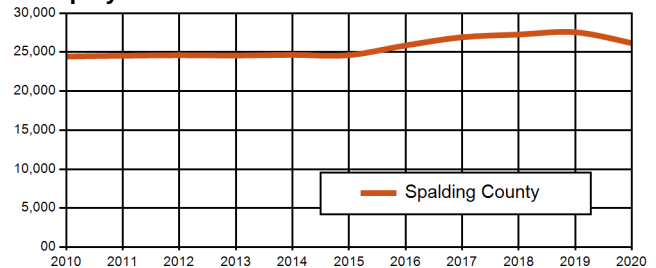

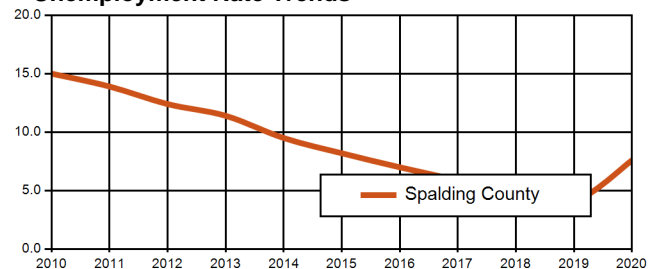

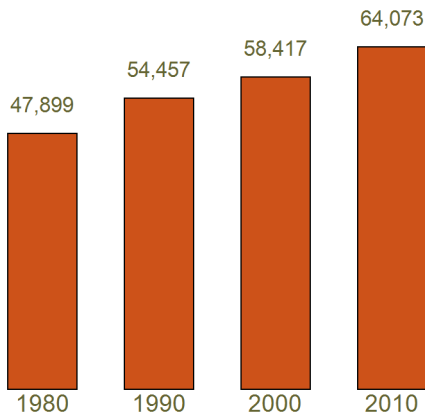

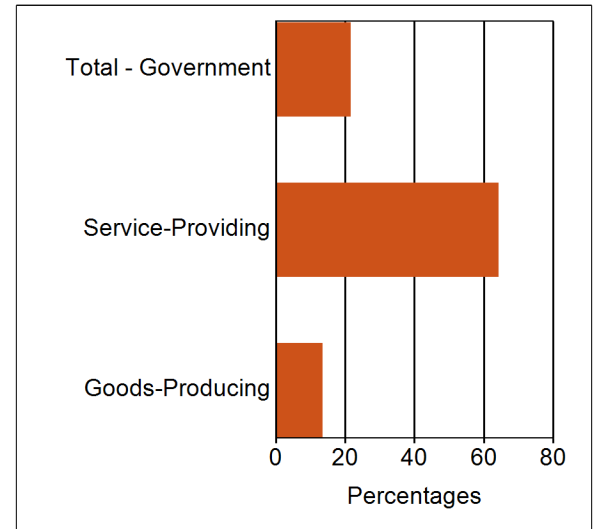
## Spalding Per Capita Income
