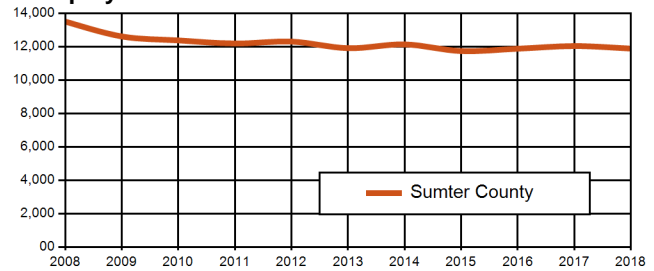

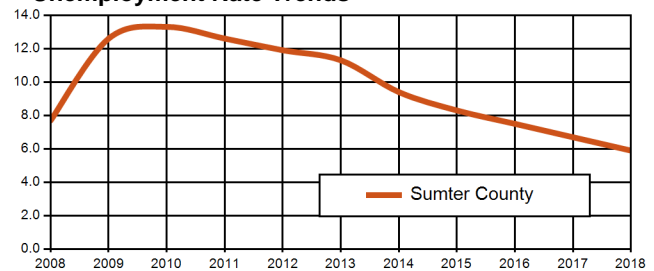

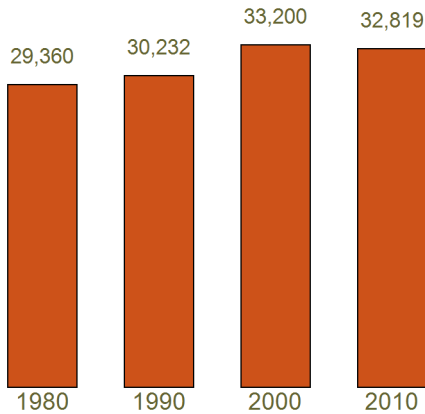
Unemployment Rate Trends

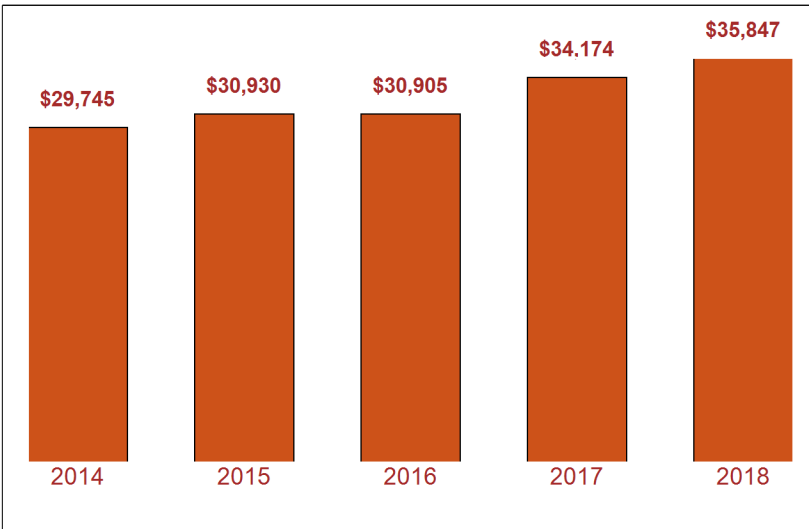

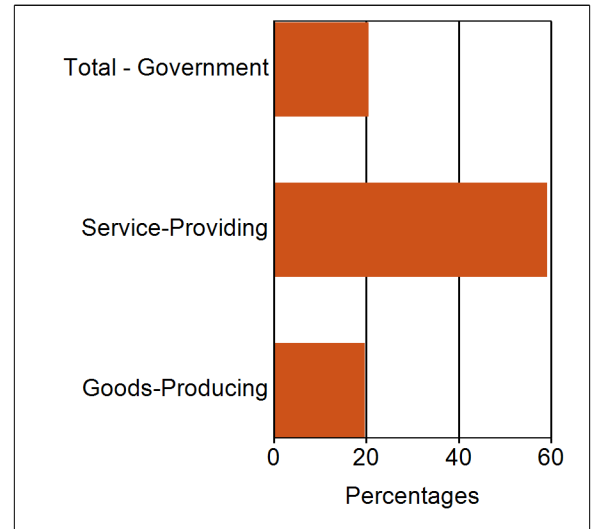
Sumter Per Capita Income
