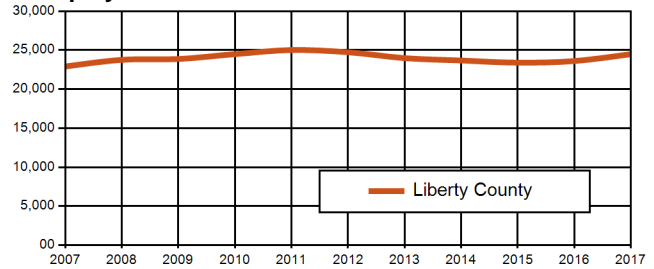

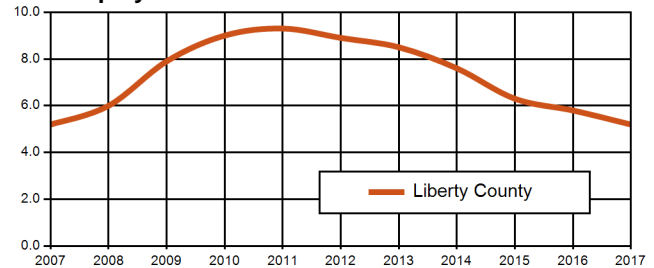

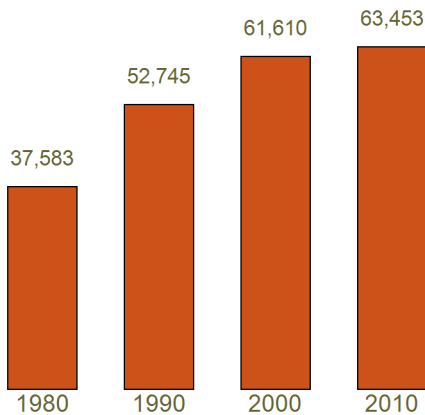
Employment Trends

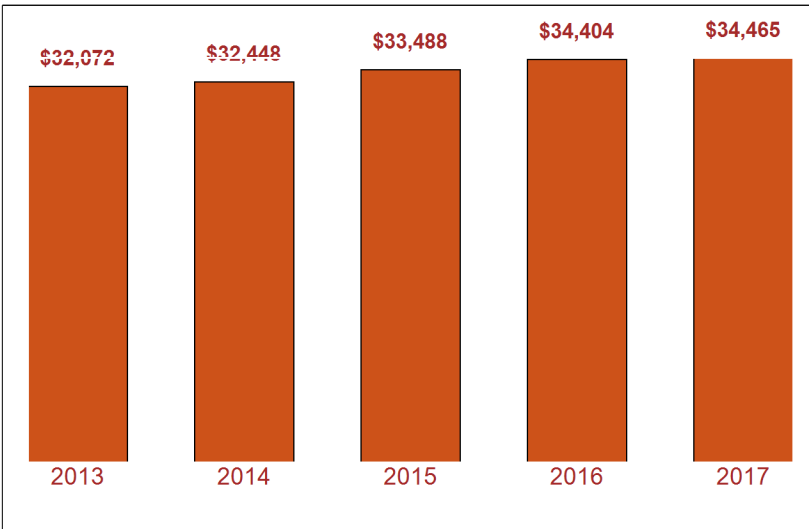

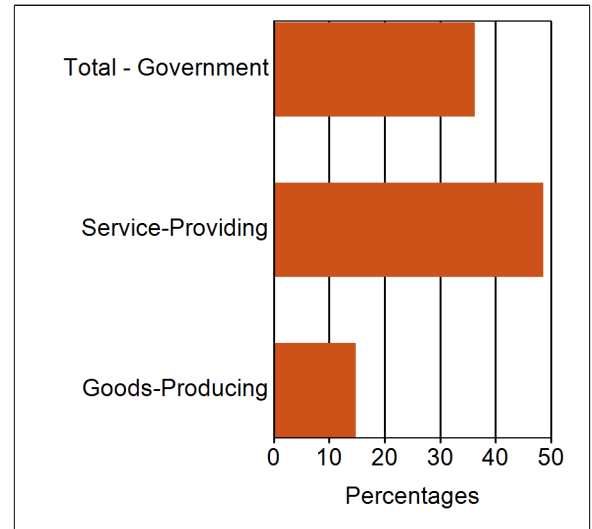
Liberty Per Capita Income
