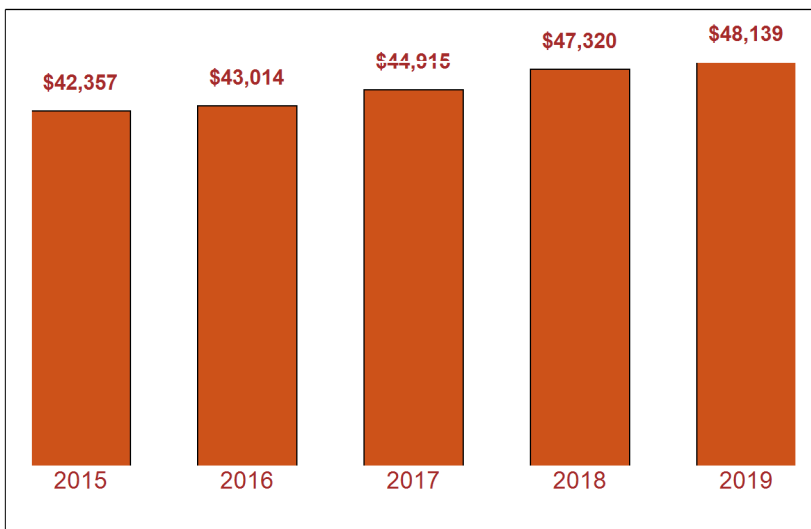

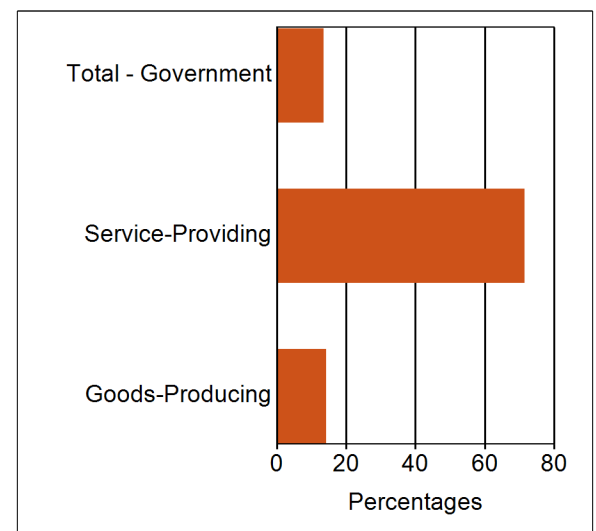
### Savannah, GA Metropolitan Statistical Area Per Capita Income

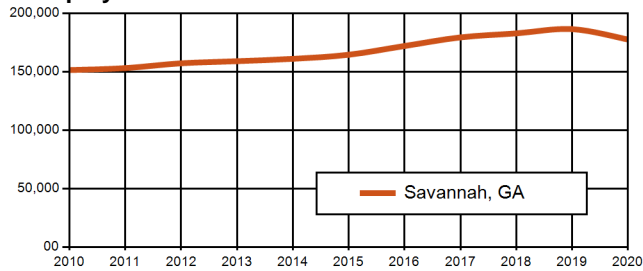

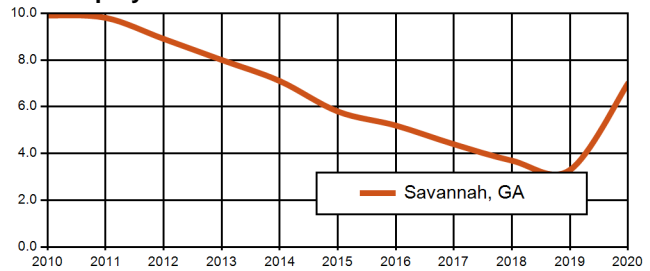

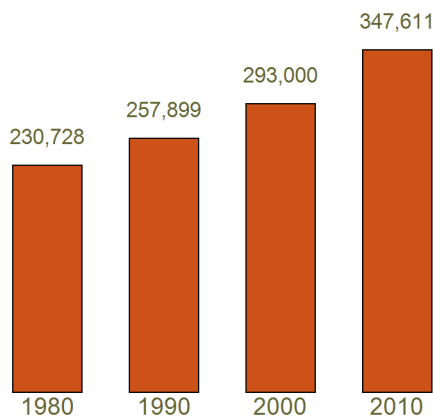
