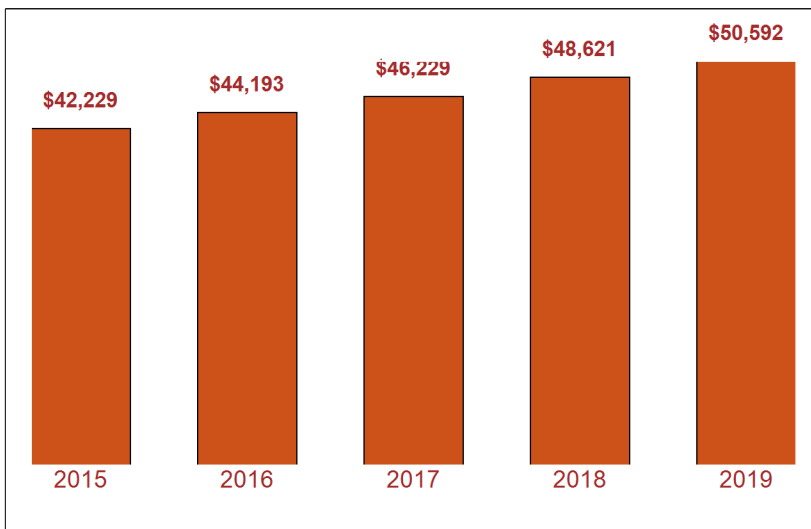

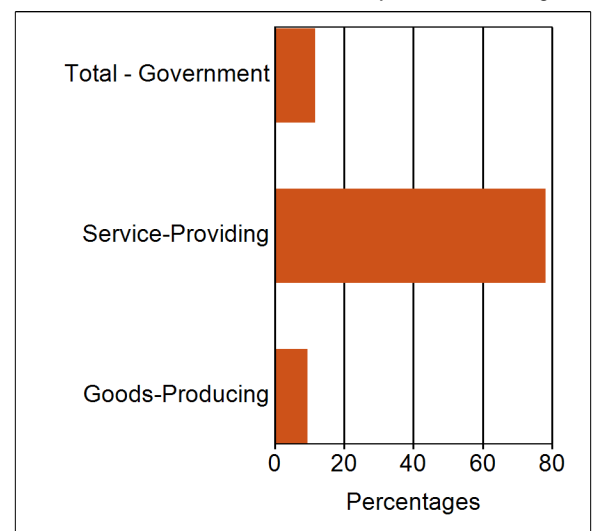

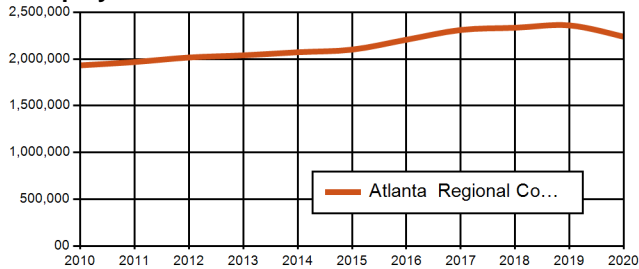

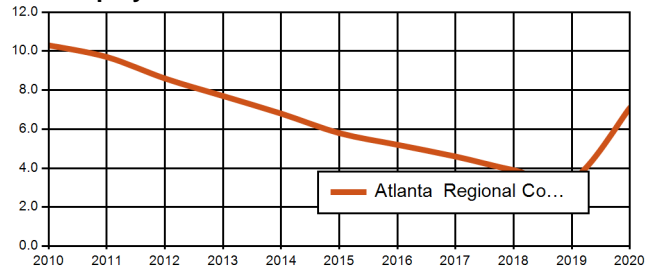

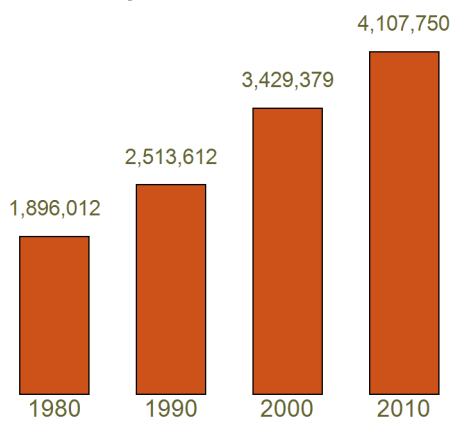
Employment Trends
