July 2021 Employment Situation

In July, nonfarm employment in Georgia was up 43,600, or 1.0 percent. Leisure and hospitality; professional and business services; and trade, transportation, and utilities saw the most jobs added over the month. Manufacturing was the lone major sector that saw a decline in jobs from June to July.

Leisure and hospitality employment increased by 15,400 in July after growing by 7,800 in June. Accommodation and food services added 15,200 jobs in July as the industry has now grown for three months in a row while arts, entertainment, and recreation added 200 jobs in July after holding flat in June. Professional and business services employment grew by 9,600 in July after being up 7,800 jobs in June. The sector has now grown for 15 consecutive months with the July growth resulting from administrative and support services adding 7,100 jobs, professional and technical services employment being up 1,800, and management of companies growing by 700 nonfarm employees. Trade, transportation, and utilities employment increased by 4,900 in July after growing by 9,600 in June. The wholesale trade portion of the sector added 2,000 workers in July, as did the retail trade industry. The transportation, warehousing, and utilities industry added 900 jobs in July.

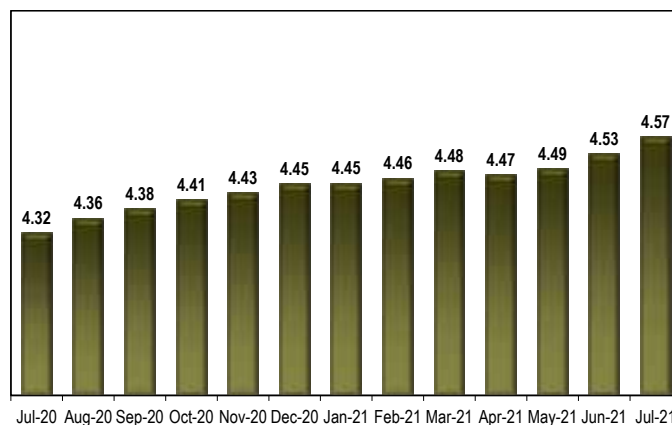
Manufacturing employment decreased by 800 in July after growing by 1,100 in June. Durable goods manufacturing endured a decline of 1,900 jobs in July and non-durable goods saw employment grow by 1,100 over the month.

Over the year, employment in Georgia is up 249,500, or 5.8 percent. Professional and business services (+67,300 jobs), leisure and hospitality (+57,300 jobs), trade, transportation, and utilities (+47,200 jobs), and education and health services (+32,100 jobs) added the most jobs from July 2020 to July 2021.

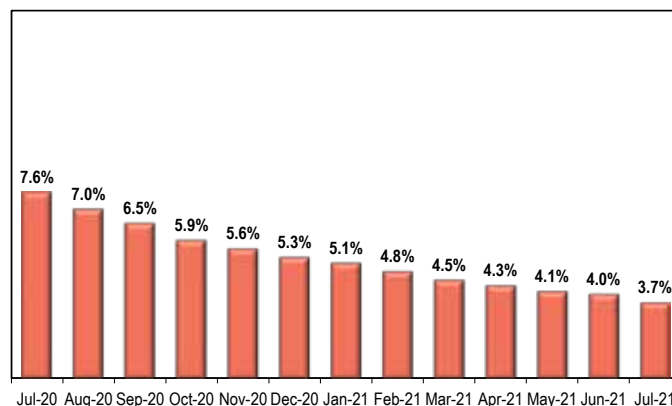
Georgia's unemployment rate (seasonally adjusted) declined to 3.7 percent in July from 4.0 percent in June 2021. Over the year, the unemployment rate is down from 7.6 percent in July 2020.

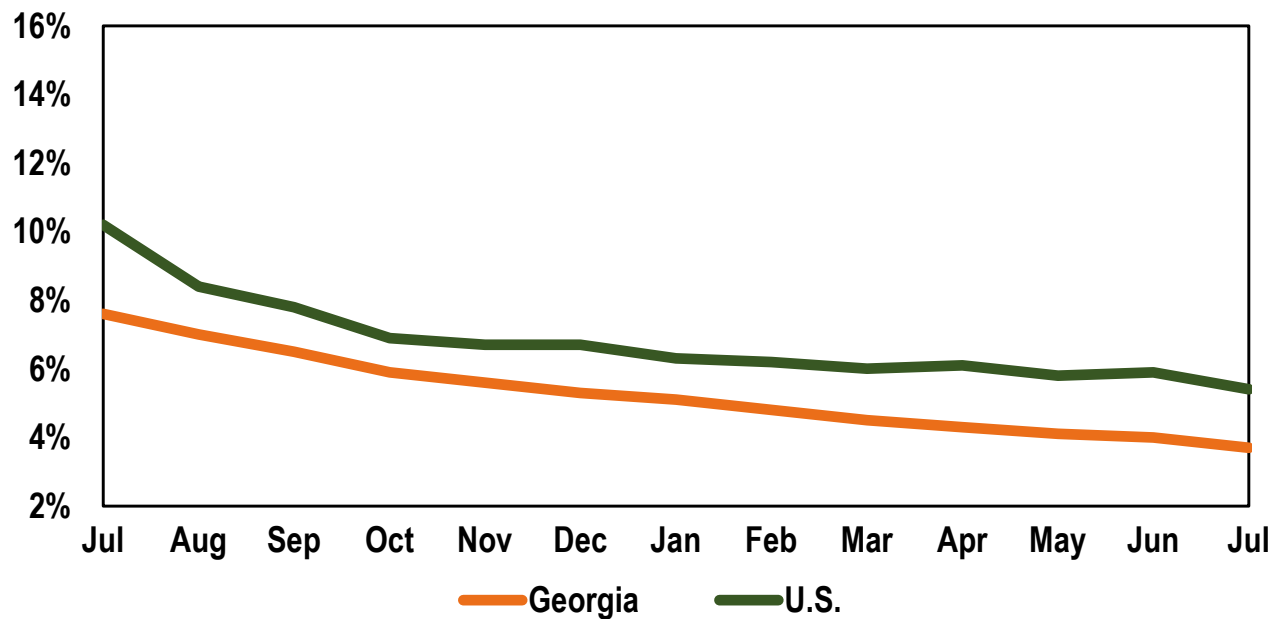

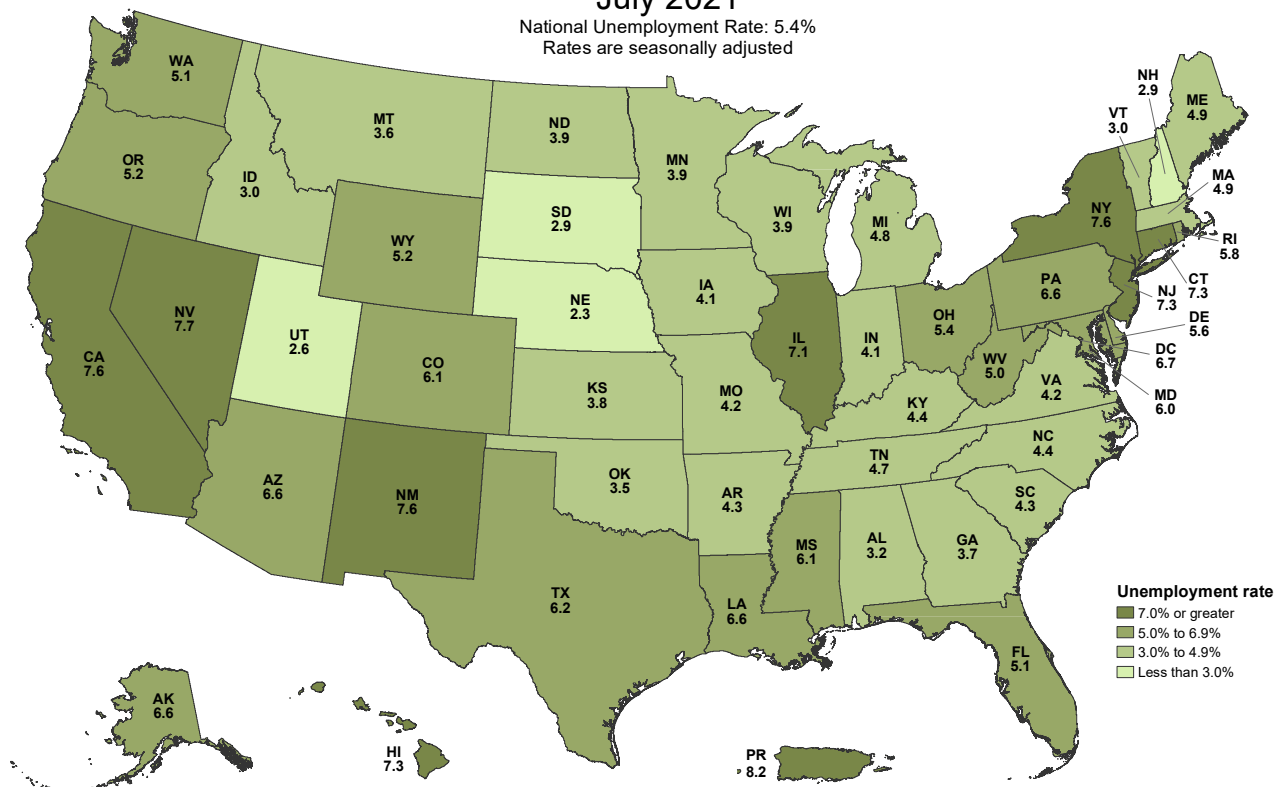
Unemployment rates — Georgia and U.S.

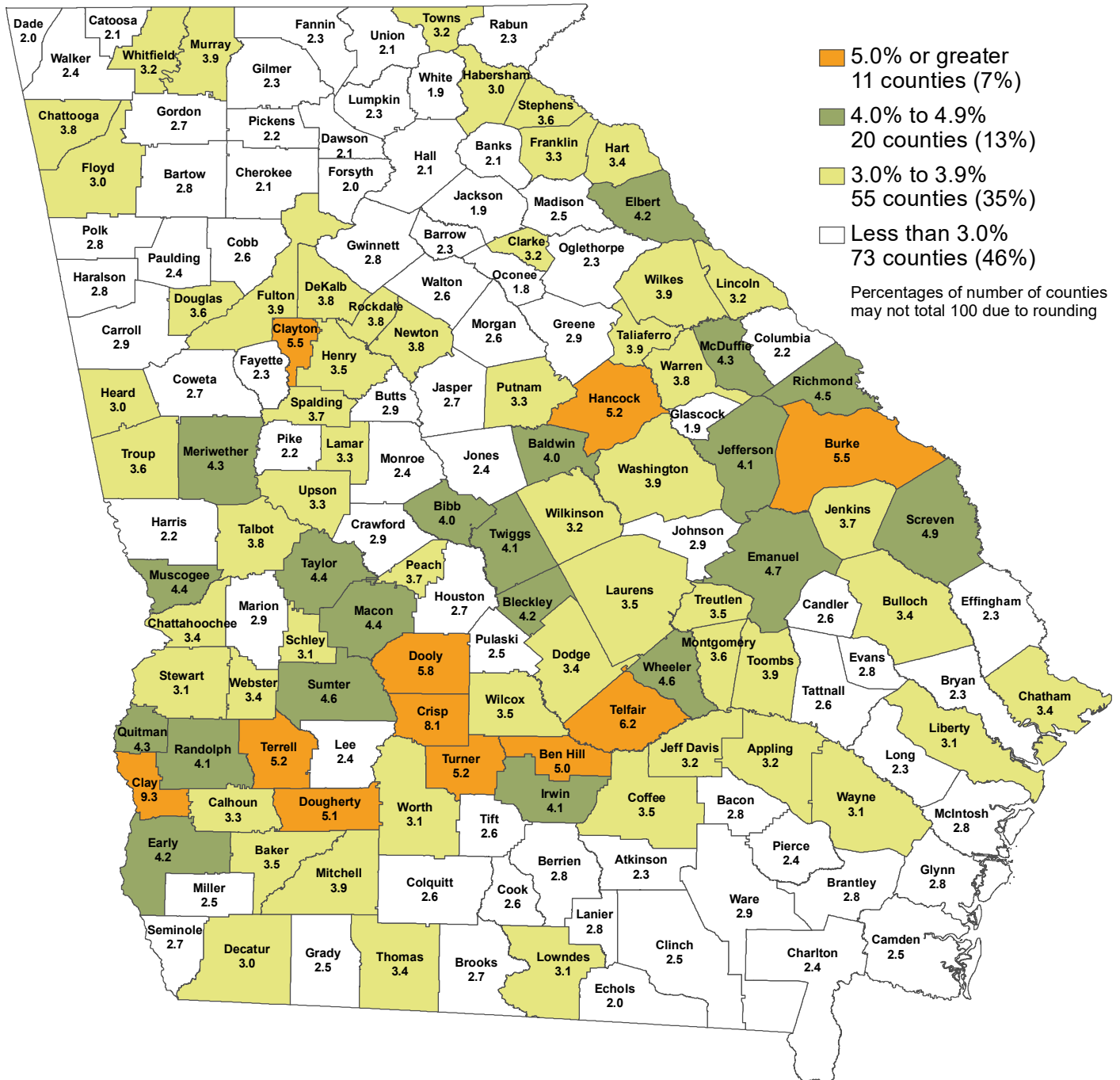
