


Fastest Growing Occupations

These fast-growing occupations will have better employment prospects than occupations with slow or declining employment. Also, conditions will be more favorable for mobility and advancement.

Seven of these occupations are in healthcare services.

Seven have earned the **Hot** designation on a statewide basis for the period 2012-2022.

Ten of these occupations typically require a bachelor's degree or more education.




Occupations with the Most Annual Openings

Of the total annual openings (3,880) on this list, over 62 percent (2,420) will result from the need to replace workers who change jobs rather than from new job creation (1,460).

Three of these occupations typically require a bachelor's degree or more education.

Three of the 15 jobs are in office and administrative support occupations.


On a statewide basis, three of these occupations have earned the **Hot** designation for the projections period.

WIA #20 – Coastal Georgia




This area encompasses 10 counties in the coastal region of southeast Georgia in and around the city of Savannah. It includes the following counties: Bryan, Bulloch, Camden, Chatham, Effingham, Glynn, Liberty, Long, and McIntosh.

Total Industry Growth

Total employment in Coastal Georgia WIA #20 is expected to grow from about 264,000 in 2012 to almost 314,000 by 2022, which equates to an average of about 5,000 new jobs added each year. This area is the home of a regional medical center and several military installations. It is also the home of a thriving tourist industry and one of the largest seaports in the southeastern United States. Principal industries include leisure and hospitality, educational services, health services, transportation and warehousing, transportation equipment manufacturing, and federal and state government.


The top ten industries in this area with the most job growth are listed below.



Industry Rate of Growth

Employment in WIA #20 – Coastal Georgia is projected to grow at a rate of about 1.7 percent per year through 2022. The area’s waterways, ports, manufacturing and tourism are expected to continue to flourish over the next decade. Expected job growth in the area is above both the statewide annual average growth rate (1.5 percent) and the national average (1.1 percent).

Occupations with the Most Growth

These 15 occupations – out of more than 800 - are projected to add almost 16,000 jobs over the next 10 years, representing nearly one-third of all projected job growth in this area.

Four of these occupations generally require education beyond high school.

Three of the fifteen occupations are in office and administrative support.

Four have made the list of Georgia’s **Hot** Careers to 2022 as a result of their fast job growth, high wages, and plentiful job openings over the period 2012-2022.
