


Fastest Growing Occupations

These fast-growing occupations will have better employment prospects than occupations with slow or declining employment. Also, conditions will be more favorable for mobility and advancement.

Eight of the 15 fastest growing occupations are in the healthcare industry.

Four of these occupations generally require a bachelor's degree or more education.

Five jobs have made the list of Georgia's **Hot** Careers to 2022 for this period.




Occupations with the Most Annual Openings

Of the annual openings (1,190) on this list, most will result from the need to replace workers who change jobs (800, 67 percent) rather than from new job creation (390, 33 percent).

Four of these jobs are in sales and office and administrative support.

Most (9) of these occupations typically require at least a high-school degree.


Although these occupations have many projected annual openings, more than half of them pay less than the state average wage.

WIA #11 – Middle Georgia




This area is made up of 10 counties in middle Georgia in and around the city of Warner Robins. It includes the following counties: Baldwin, Crawford, Houston, Jones, Monroe, Peach, Pulaski, Putnam, Twiggs and Wilkinson.

Total Industry Growth

Total employment in Middle Georgia WIA #11 is expected to grow from almost 114,000 in 2012 to nearly 127,000 by 2022. The growth equates to an average of about 1,300 new jobs added each year. This area is home to two regional medical centers, the state's largest facility for treatment of mental illness and developmental disabilities, several colleges and universities, and a large military base. There is significant employment in healthcare services, the federal government, and educational services in this area.


The top ten industries in this area with the most job growth are listed below.



Industry Rate of Growth

Employment in WIA #11 – Middle Georgia is expected to grow at a rate of about 1.1 percent annually through 2022. The job growth in the area is below the statewide annual average job growth (1.5 percent) and on par with the national average (1.1 percent).

Occupations with the Most Growth

These 15 occupations – out of more than 800 - are projected to add 4,500 jobs over the next 10 years, almost 35 percent of all projected job growth in this area.

Six of the 15 jobs generally require at least some college or postsecondary education.

Five of these occupations are in education or healthcare.
